Older patients are often treated by several healthcare. The suboptimal prescribing in the geriatric population use professionals, including different prescribing physicians, the following three categories: which may lead to duplicate prescribing and serious Overprescribing or overuse of medicines: application of reactions and follow-up of safety and effectiveness of vague indications. medications prescribed to older patients.

Inappropriate prescribing in older understood in many studies to be the prescribing of medication that is potentially inappropriate in older age. so-called These PIMs (potentially inappropriate medications) have been identified by a consensus of expert panels as medications that carry more risks than benefits for older adults. While safer alternatives exist in the pharmaceutical market, PIMs should not be prescribed to older patients because of their higher risks of drug-therapy problems.

problems with inappropriate prescribing. There are also higher doses of medicine than is clinically necessary; inconsistencies in updates on information about excessive or inappropriate polypharmacy; long-term use of indications, duration of therapy, monitoring of adverse medication without proved efficacy; use of medication in

> Underprescribing or underuse of medicines: use of lower patients is than optimal doses; not prescribing medications known to be effective and safe in geriatric patients.

> > Inappropriate prescribing: prescribing PIMs in geriatric patients; prescribing despite known drug-drug or drugdisease interactions.

> > Inappropriate medication use is a general term describing a range of problems arising from the prescription, administration, and storing of medication, as well as problems with medication nonadherence.

Be "downsized" first Be passed over for promotions/raises Find their suggestions/observations ignored and/or denigrated Find it very difficult to get a new job



## On TELEVISION, OA's:

Are largely absent from Saturday AM cartoons (unless they are witches) Show up primarily in ads for healthproblem-oriented products Are depicted in stereotypical fashions
